Compulsory: WALT: explore how to use different materials to create a collage

This term our topic is 'Land, Sea and Sky'. For your homework we would like you to create a world map. To do this you need to draw and cut round a dinner plate on a piece of card/paper and then decorate it as you wish, showing the different land and water masses! We are looking for colourful, creative maps to hang around the classroom! You could use newspaper, crepe paper, mosaic, tissue paper.

Challenge: create an evaluation of what you could do to improve your creation.

English - WALT: understand how to use inverted commas

One of our focuses this half term is inverted commas. For your homework we would like you to write an adventure story where there is a significant amount of dialogue. Make sure you use inverted commas correctly.

Use ! in your speech
Use ! and ? in your speech
Write a conversation between two speakers

Maths - WALT: create a multiplication poster

We are going to be completing our Multiplication Tables Check. It is important to keep practising your times tables! Please create a multiplication poster about the different times tables that you know.

Describe 2 of your times tables.

Describe 4 of your times tables.

Describe 6 of your times tables.

Science - WALT: investigate how animals adapt to their habitats

Pick a water animal of your choice and research how it has evolved to live in its surroundings. For example: Does it have fins? How do fins help the animal to live in their habitat?

Create a poster to show this information.

Challenge: Can you write a paragraph explaining multiple adaptations.

French - WALT: create a profile of a pet in French

In our French this term we will be focusing on
 animals, specifically our pets. For your
homework we would like you to pick an animal /
pet and describe it. Could you draw a picture
 and label it?

How old are they? What animal is it?

Can you add more details based on our past topics?

Pretend you are in a boat out at sea. Describe the setting around you using a range of descriptive techniques! Think about what you can see, hear, smell, touch and taste whilst you are on this voyage.
