1. English

WALT: research a famous person.

To continue our learning from our current book *Young, Gifted and Black*, write a fact file about a significant person of your choice. You will need to research where they were born, why they are famous and what difference to the world today.

WALT: structure and write a poem.

3. Maths

4. Times Tables

WALT: explore times tables.

5. Science

WALT: research sound waves.

Research then create a poster all about sound waves.

Consider how you hear different sounds, volume and pitch. Think about how you hear noises, where they come from and what makes certain sounds more difficult to hear.

WALT: understand the importance of things.
