1. Compulsory

WALT: Reflect on past events

We would like you to reflect on your first year at school so far! Draw a picture of what comes into your mind when you think of school. You could write some key words or sentences. It may be your teachers, your friends, the playground, a favourite lesson or trip perhaps. Feel free to incorporate more than one idea.

2. Health and Self-care

WALT promote a healthy lifestyle

We keep fit and healthy at school by taking part in P.E lessons and running around on the playground. Can you tell us about how you keep a healthy lifestyle at home? You could use drawings, sentences, photos to show us some examples! Think about clubs, food, how you get to/from school.

3. English

WALT use adjectives to describe

Choose a fairy tale character. Write some words to describe a character by using adjectives or sentences to describe their personality and appearance.

4. English

WALT use tricky words

We have been working really hard learning tricky words. They are 'tricky' because these words cannot be phonetically spelt. Practice as many tricky words as you can. Then try to put them into your own sentences!

5. Maths

Maths - WALT explore money

Investigate the value of coins; go to your local shop/supermarket with an adult and use money to pay for items. You might like to record the coins you have used. How much are they worth? What can you buy with your coins?

6. Maths

WALT name and identify 3d shapes

Go on a 3d shape hunt around your home or while you are out. What 3d shapes can you find? Can you name them?

Challenge: Can you investigate the properties of the 3d shapes? Can they roll, stack, slide?

7. Science

WALT talk about changes in animals and lifecycles

What changes do animals go through? What happens first in a lifecycle of a butterfly? Can you have a go at drawing a lifecycle? You could record this on paper and draw what happens first, then next and then finally.

8. Experience

WALT act out a story

Choose your favourite fairy tale and act it out to your adults at home. You could use props or objects to help you retell your story.

9. Art

WALT: explore drawing from our imagination

There are often castles in fairy tales. On an A4 page, using your imagination, draw and colour your own version of a fairy tale castle. How many windows will you draw, will it have turrets, and will you draw a moat around it? Try to make your picture fill the whole page by adding the sky and the land surrounding the castle.

WALT: Negotiate space successfully

Create a game, obstacle course or activity by including friends or people you know. How can you move around the course, what direction or speed/pace can you move at? Can you jump, hop or walk? Can you record the actions or movements you do on a tally chart?
